
The Frank Martin Year has started!

Frank Martin (60) A series of short films in which musicians and other experts tell us what Frank Martin's music means to them personally. In this short video the

violinist Maria Milstein characterizes his Trio on Irish Folk Songs. Maria Milstein won prizes as a soloist and chamber musician at major international competitions. In 2016 she was awarded the Fellowship of the

Borletti Buitoni Trust, and in 2018 she received the Netherlands Music Prize -

the highest recognition for a classical musician in the Netherlands, awarded by the Ministry of Culture. With pianist Hannes Minnaar and cellist Gideon den Herder, Maria Milstein is a member of the **Van Baerle Trio**, one of the leading trios of its generation. It's repertoire includes Frank Martin's Trio sur des mélodies populaires irlandaises (Trio on Irish Folk Songs), which they will perform several times in **2024**.




Searching for Frank Martin on Google yields a screen full of images of a surly, bristly haired basketball coach from South Carolina. On half the

photos he scowls into the distance, on the other half he does little other




